What were the key takeaways from this session?

Working on SSI and SSDI is possible! Report everything to Social Security.

Learned you can apply for EAFDC for presumptive disability while waiting for SSI - Special condition work incentive is paid by the employer - Understood a lot more in the insurance section after hearing it for a second time (I attended last year).

SSDI and SSI are not as similar as they initially appear.

SSI calculator shows what happens in different work scenarios.

What could we have done better?

Spelling out the abbreviations a little more. Alphabet soup gets confusing.

Identifying and breaking up the trainings as Beginner/ Intermediate/Advanced. I would have liked to see an example of how to report wages to SS using the app in order to be able to assist an individual.

Add a day, slow down and offer more opportunities to practice with the representative.
